What is the organization aiming to accomplish?

The Paralyzed Veterans of America – Iowa Chapter (IPVA) is a nonprofit veterans service organization chartered by Congress and one of 33 chapters representing the national organization, Paralyzed Veterans of America (PVA).

Our **mission** is to improve the quality of life for Veterans with spinal cord injuries or diseases (SCI/D), their families, and all individuals with disabilities. Membership is **free** and open to U.S. Armed Forces Veterans with SCI/D diagnoses.

We strive to:

- Improve **medical care** and access
- Secure necessary benefits
- Offer life-enhancing programs and community opportunities for our members and others with disabilities

What are the organization's key strategies for achieving its mission?

- Claims Assistance: Provide a National Service Officer to assist Veterans in navigating the Veterans Administration (VA) claims process
- **Sports & Recreation:** Sponsor member participation in events like the *National Veterans Wheelchair Games, Midwest PVA Fishing Event*, and *Shooting Sports*
- **Healthcare Support:** Provide funding for patient programs at Iowa's VA Medical Centers (Des Moines and Iowa City) and the Iowa Veterans Home in Marshalltown
- Professional Training: Fund training opportunities for medical personnel who treat individuals with SCI/D

- Research Support: Contribute to local and national organizations promoting quality-of-life improvements and cures for SCI/D
- Advocacy & Accessibility: Promote public accessibility and educate communities on the needs of individuals with disabilities
- Social & Family Engagement: Offer events, caregiver support, and peer mentoring to encourage connection and healing within our community

What are the organization's capabilities for doing this work?

- **Collaboration with VA Systems:** We maintain close partnerships with Des Moines and Iowa City VAMCs and the Iowa Veterans Home through advisory committees and system-wide collaboration on healthcare barriers and prosthetic access
- **Direct Service Support:** Through our National Service Officer, we provide **individualized assistance** with benefits, appeals, and care navigation
- **Peer Mentorship Program:** A committee of IPVA members with SCI/D, MS, or ALS connects with newly injured Veterans to offer support and understanding through shared experiences
- Annual Member Outreach: Every member is contacted yearly by a board member to assess healthcare satisfaction and identify unmet needs using a consistent outreach script
- **Newsletter Communications:** Our bi-monthly newsletter keeps members informed, highlights successes, and provides a vehicle for feedback

How will we know if we are making progress?

Progress is assessed through:

- Annual program reviews by the Board of Directors to ensure alignment, efficiency, and fiscal responsibility
- **Direct member contact** by board members and the peer mentorship committee to evaluate satisfaction with VA services and identify needs

- **Event participation metrics** to gauge engagement and impact (e.g., Fishing Event capacity, increased attendance at Trapshoots)
- Community feedback through newsletters and donor responses, which serve as informal barometers of organizational performance
- Strategic adjustments based on program reviews, member input, and shifts in the SCI/D care landscape

What have we accomplished so far, and what's next?

- Membership has grown slightly, but member participation has significantly increased
- Our **Board of Directors is holding strong at 11 members**, with more candidates than openings in our latest election.
- The **Midwest PVA Fishing Event** was another massive success serving over 20 veterans and their caregivers.
- Our annual Trapshoot remains one of the largest in the National PVA circuit
- In 2025, IPVA sent the largest team we've ever had to the National Veterans Wheelchair Games.
- We now co-host an accessible bowling event with United Spinal Association.
- Plan to add more partnerships with other non-profit groups geared toward accessibility such as Birdability.

Our partnerships are a vital part of our success. Organizations like ITC, BJL, Al's Bri, All Hands On Deck, and our loyal monthly and annual donors make our work possible. We are committed to nurturing these relationships to ensure that every member can benefit from the programs we offer.
